### Hello Christine,

As requested, attached is the 2012 memo again with the analytical results in Appendix B (the last time Starfield did this work) and for comparison the 2013 memo (the first time Canadian North completed the sampling of the fuel berm waters).

We don't have firm date of opening the camp/sampling the waters yet but likely to be the last two weeks of July, so will send the detailed schedule to you as soon as we have the program planned.

Checked the exact lat-long coordinates of the discharge points for the fuel berm waters, and still very close to that of the camp coordinates in the 2013 annual report:

62 deg. 53 min. 33 sec. N, 96 deg. 54 min. 04 sec. W

We'll be sending the Work Plan, Annual Report with the updated plans next within a couple weeks.

In follow-up to the water use inspection report and our phone conversation, we are working on completing our 2015 Work Plan and 2014 annual Report for the Ferguson Lake Project which should be submitted by the middle of April. We apologize for the delay in getting this done. We are also working on the updated Spill Contingency Plan and Abandonment and Restoration Plan reports and the other points mentioned in the inspection report.

We are planning to open the camp in July-August this year to do inspections, sampling, maintenance and repairs (if necessary).

I may coordinate an inspection during the time that your staff will be onsite. This will give us a chance to complete an inspection with a representative present. Please provide the dates and I will do my best to accommodate your schedule.

In answer to your question as to the coordinates of discharge point when draining water from the fuel berm; it is the same as that of the camp: Latitude 62 deg. 53 min. 33 sec. N, Longitude 96 deg. 54 min. 05 sec.

Are these co-ordinates the location of discharge or the general site locations. Please refer to your licence PART J item 3.

The Licensee shall determine the GPS co-ordinates (in degrees, minutes and seconds of latitude and longitude) of all locations where Wastes associated with camp operations and drilling operations are deposited.

Specifically, it is located just adjacent to the NW corner of the fuel berm. An attached photo looking to the NW shows the fuel berm location in relation to the camp. Evidence for this location is an attached memo we retrieved for Starfield Resources which discussed the discharge of the treated waters in October 2012 and the arrow in the figure shows the location of discharge. Based upon our information, this was the last time any waters have been drained from the berm.

Thank you for the document titled "A.1\_0577-003 Fuel Containment Area Memo 2012 locations of pumping". I see Appendix B is not included in the document, which contains the PAH sampling results. I request a copy so that I may add it to our files.

Canadian North Resources and Development Corp. did not drain any waters from the berm in 2013 after we had sampled and tested it during that summer because by the time the analytical results were reported indicating there was no hydrocarbon contamination, the camp had been closed up again.

In any case as required, we will provide you with 10 days notice of any plans to drain the fuel berm waters this summer while we are at the Ferguson Lake camp.
