Gentlemen

In an effort to reduce costs and use our funds in the most effective manner, Starfield Resources Inc will be temporarily closing the exploration camp located at Ferguson Lake at the end of April, 2009 and the camp support staff will be removed. At that time there will be approximately 33000 litres of bulk P50, 30 sealed drums of Jet B fuel and 60 drums of used waste oil, fuel and lubricants at the site. All these items will be placed within the lined earthen berm. The bulk P50 fuel will be placed in steel, double walled enviro tanks and the drummed fuel will be placed with the bungs in the 3-9 o'clock positions. The bermed area has an area of approx 2,400 cubic meters so the volume of fuels and lubes is less than 5% of the storage capacity contained within the berm. All the fuel in mobile equipment will be reduced to approx 10% of the fuel tank capacity and external storage such as that for generators will be drawn down to approx 10% of fuel tank capacities. All stationary storage has lined catchment under the tanks in the event leakage occurs. In the main camp buildings all water storage tanks will be emptied, water lines will be blown clean and traps will be filled with RV antifreeze. All garbage will be incinerated and buildings will be locked and sealed. Propane tanks will be secured and all tank valves will be closed.

The closing is temporary and the camp will be reopened as soon as the economics improve. The helicopter supported exploration survey will be completed by the end of April and should be evaluated within a couple of months. We will keep you all informed regarding the reopening of the camp at Ferguson Lake.
