Good afternoon Janet – In response to your email please see below an itemized list of what our internal public registry shows.

- a) Initial application was received in February 2008 and contained the following documents: Application form, application cover letter, Figure 1 Project Area, Figure 2 Camp Area, Supplementary Questionnaire, Spill Plan, and Project Summaries in English and Inuktitut.
- b) Licence was issued on May 11, 2008
- c) Part H, Item 1 of the issued Licence required that a revised Spill Plan be submitted. The revised plan was received on July 11, 2008 and was approved in a letter dated August 7, 2008
- d) Part I, Item 1 of the issued Licence required that a site-specific AR Plan be submitted for approval. Please note that an AR Plan was not initially submitted with the Application. The required AR Plan was received on June 30, 2008 and was approved by the Board under Motion 2008-05-10 on September 15, 2008. An addendum to this approved plan was to be submitted by October 15, 2008 and there is no record of this plan being received in our office.
- e) The annual report we have on file is from 2008. The NWB does not have a report for 2009 and there is no formal indication in our files that there was no further work being planned or carried out on the project after 2008 other than the 2008 annual report indicating that "all sumps were treated with lime and backfilled to previous contours. All camp materials were removed from site."
- f) With regard to the in-depth diagram of the camp area, received as part of the revised spill plan it is not the Nunavut Water Board's policy to extract portions of one plan to be considered for another. Therefore the requirement to submit a revised AR Plan, taking into account the comments received from INAC remains outstanding.

If the company has determined that the project is not going to go forward then there is a requirement to submit an application for cancellation (copy attached), accompanied by the \$30.00 administration fee. The application will be treated as any other with a 30 day review period following submission of the required documentation. There is also the requirement to provide the water use fees for 2009 and 2010 which were due and payable on May 11, 2009 and May 11, 2010 for an amount totaling \$60.00.

Ms. Beaulieu,

I have been monitoring Barry Hanslit's email while he is out of town. In order to respond to any time sensitive issues that arise during his absence. The revisions to the abandonment and reclamation plan that were requested were submitted to you by email on June 30, 2008 well within the original time-frame. I am forwarding a copy of the original email in the event that you have misplaced it. The in-depth diagram of the camp area was provided in the 31 page spill plan submitted on July 10, 2008 and the acceptance email returned to me on July 21, 2008. Since the start of the license period, only one field season was conducted as delineated in the Annual report submitted on March 23, 2009 and approved on May 9, 2009. As was stated in this report work on the property consisted of three persons prospecting for less than one week. Water consumption was strictly on a personal consumption basis and thus truly does not even require a water license. Again as represented in the amended abandonment plan all reclamation was completed on a on-going basis, such that the land was returned to it's natural state at the end of the field season. In the larger picture this tiny exploration program had less impact than even an equivalent camping trip as no wildlife was spotted or harassed in any manner.
