Dear Phyllis Beaulieu

The Government of Nunavut – Department of Culture, Language, Elders' and Youth (GN-CLEY) has reviewed the documentation for an Amendment Type B application of Sabina Gold and Silver Corporation for waste water disposal, and general water uses, associated with adding camps for exploration, beyond the company's Goose Lake campsite.

The department does not object to the application. However, the department urges the proponent to be sensitive to the prevalence of heritage resources in the proponent's locations of research. The department identified 107 archaeological sites within the boundary of the proponent's operational area.

Accordingly, the proponent must understand that it is their responsibility to ensure that no sites are disturbed in the course of activities. Should any additional sites or artifacts be encountered, the proponent must contact the Department of Culture, Language, Elders and Youth. All archaeological and palaeontological sites in Nunavut are protected by law.
