A. BACKGROUND

On October 6, 2016 the Nunavut Water Board approved a renewal License for Aura Silver Resources Ltd, 2BE- GRE1621.

In a time stamped, undated letter located on the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) FTP site a notification to the NWB from John Mc Neice of Aura Silver Resources Ltd identified Mr. David Frenette, Environment Coordinator at Agnico Eagle Mines Ltd (AEM) is authorized by Aura Silver Resources Inc. to act as their representative with respect to matters relating to Water License No. 2BE-GRE1416, the Greyhound project.

On the 15th of November, 2018 Aura Silver Resources shareholders approved a name change and stock consolidation for the company. The company's new name was identified as "Aura Resources Inc." Aura Resources Inc. then changed its name to Gold79 Mines Ltd. on August 4, 2020.

On May 12, 2021 the NWB received an application from Gold79 Mines Ltd. for the assignment of 2BE-GRE1621 to Agnico Eagle Mines Ltd and identified Olivier Grondin of AEM as the responsible party.

C. RESULTS OF REVIEW

1. Review of requirements for submission of Application for Assignment

Comment:

The Nunavut Water Board published an Application for Assignment and Declaration of Licensee ¹ includes a guide and list of the required documents to be filed in support of such an application. This list was reviewed as part of the submission by the licensee for review in consideration of the assignment of 2BE-GRE1621.

The Nunavut Water Board publishes an Application for Assignment guide for use by Licensee's. The application appears to be incomplete. In particular, CIRNAC is concerned that information regarding the assignee's capacity to implement the conditions of the water license and a schedule for the implementation of all plans, manuals and reports, has not been provided and that the acknowledgement from the Designated Inuit Organizations has not been provided in the submission.

Recommendation:

(R-01) CIRNAC recommends that the Nunavut Water Board seek clarity from the Licensee that the application package as submitted is complete, and that the assignee (AEM) confirm their capacity to implement the conditions of the water license and a schedule for the implementation of all plans, manuals and reports.
