RE: 2BE-HAK0915 Request for Open Burning - Xstrata Zinc Canada - Kitikmeot

Environment Canada (EC) has reviewed the above-mentioned request submitted to the Nunavut Water Board (NWB). The following specialist advice is provided pursuant to the Canadian Environmental Protection Act 1999, the pollution prevention provisions of the Fisheries Act, the Migratory Birds Convention Act, and the Species at Risk Act.

Xstrata Zinc is applying to the NWB to allow for controlled open burning of approximately 100m³ of untreated wood products, and occasionally cardboard, at their Hackett River Project camp. This material is either too large for the existing incinerator at the camp or is of a significant volume that it exceeds the operating capacity of the existing incinerator.

In principal, EC does not encourage the open burning of wood waste as a means of disposal. However, considering the incinerator capacity constraints at the Hackett Camp, EC recommends the Proponent consider the following guidance:

- Solid wastes that are conditionally suitable for open burning include paper products, paperboard packaging, and untreated wood. Plywood, painted wood or other treated wood should not be disposed of in this manner. - EC recommends that all associated non-combustible structure waste (i.e., plastics, tar paper, floor coverings, shingles, insulation, wiring, and tents) be thoroughly removed prior to burning.



 EC recommends that all residual waste from the burning (i.e., nails and coals) be thoroughly collected, removed from site, and disposed of at a suitable facility.
