Introduction

Diamondex conducted field exploration programs over several years as follows:

Summer 2002

Between 30 July and 7 August 2002, 287 till samples (~25 kg each) were collected by Diamondex staff. A quaternary mapping program was completed by Terrain Analysis & Mapping Services Ltd. between 1 to 3 August 2002.

Summer 2003

During 24, 26 and 31 July 2003, a total of 100 till samples (~25 kg each) were collected by Diamondex staff.

Summer 2004

No exploration work was completed on the Heeqou property itself during 2004. The pre-existing Heeqou Camp site was utilized between 16 to 24 August 2004 as the base camp for other regional reconnaissance and property work.

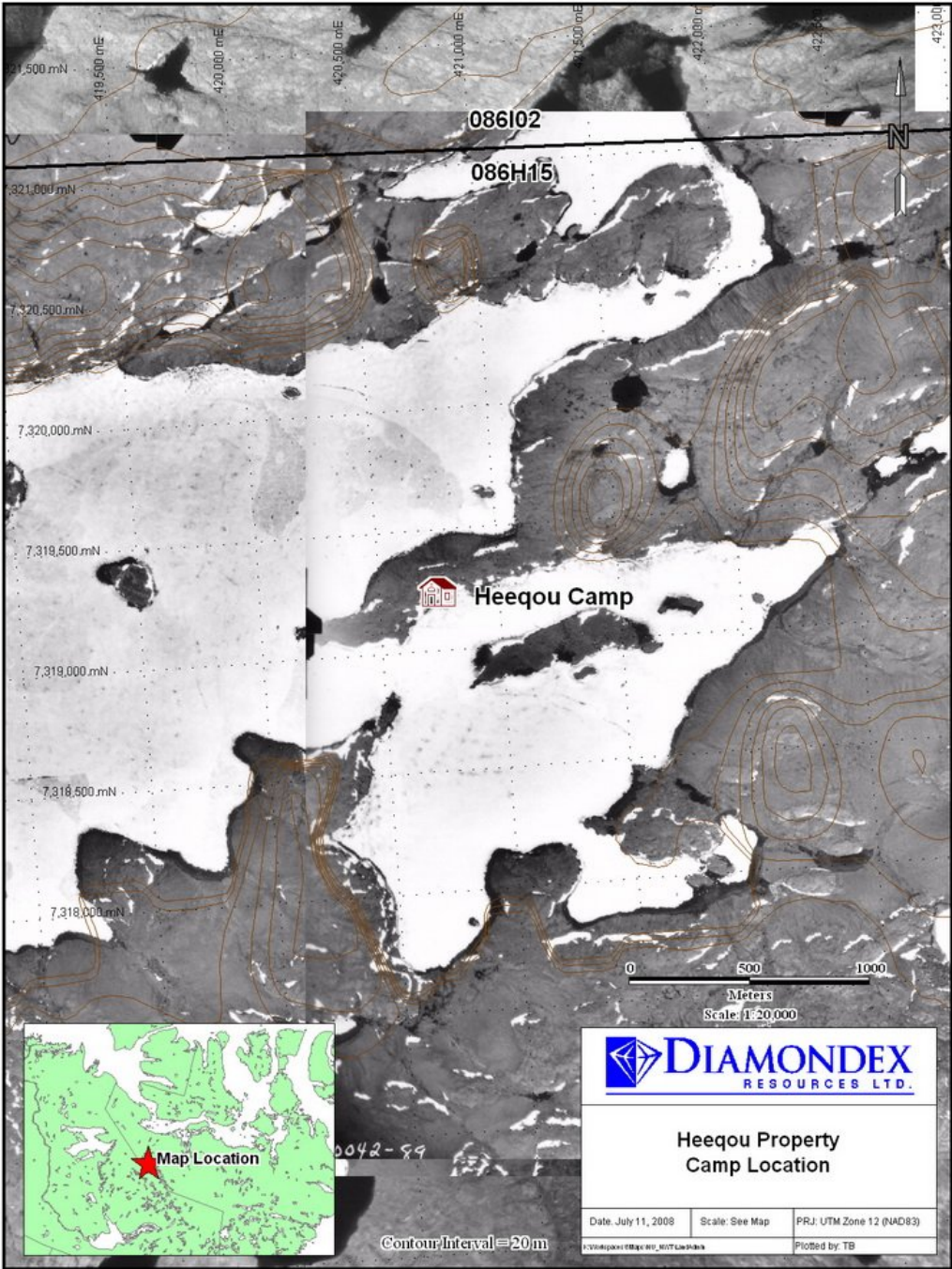
Field Camp Location

The *Heeqou Camp* was a temporary camp site, and is located at 65°59'N and 112°45'W. This camp site was used during both the 2002 and 2003 Heeqou exploration programs, as well as serving as the base camp location for Diamondex' 2004 regional exploration program. The camp was assembled and disassembled at the start and end of each of the field programs, with only tent floors and minor fuel (used in the maintenance of the camp) remaining on site at the end of exploration program.

Property Cleanup and Reclamation

The camp site has been entirely cleaned up by Discovery Mining Services in late 2008. There are no materials left on site and all fuel and all empty drums have been removed. Included below are photos of the camp in the original and restored condition.
