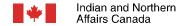

Background

The Hepburn Project borders both the Northwest Territories and Nunavut with all camp infrastructure located in the Northwest Territories. The Hepburn Project is located in an area south of the Coppermine River in the Kitikmeot Region of Nunavut. According to the 2009 Annual Report only 3 days of prospecting were conducted within the Nunavut Region of the Project, with no water use.

Recommendations/Comments

 The Proponent is required to describe, in more detail, these prospecting activities with respect to waste disposal (garbage, blackwater, greywater and human). As well as how many people were involved and whether overnight stays were required.

This outstanding information is required by Part B Item 1 of the water license.
