### ABANDONMENT AND RESTORATION PLAN

#### HIGH LAKE PROJECT

The Wolfden Resources High Lake Project is a mineral exploration project focused on base metal exploration in the High Lake volcanic belt. The High Lake Project is located in the Kitikmeot region of Nunavut, approximately 550km north-northeast of Yellowknife, NWT. The closest population center is Kugluktuk, located 175km west-northwest of the property. The property is approximately 45km south of the Coronation Gulf.

The campsite, which is located on the southwest shore of High Lake, will consist of 9 tents and will be designed to accommodate 18 people. This site is convenient due to its proximity to the main High Lake deposit and its historic use as a camp location.

Reclamation plans provide for the removal of all established camp facilities at the conclusion of the program. Removal of used materials such as drill steel and fuel drums occurs on an ongoing basis utilizing backhauls of re-supply flights. Drillsites are remediated on an ongoing basis at the conclusion of each drillhole. Each drillsite consists of minimal disturbance to the local area and is dealt with in a case by case manner.

At the conclusion of the program, the tents will be dismantled and backhauled to Yellowknife, along with camp supplies and equipment. Any excess building materials will be offered to local communities or incinerated. There will be no disturbances to natural contours or removal of overburden or soil.
