We are discussing with the Arviat HTO to better understand the seasonal movements of the caribou herd so we can see how these may overlap with our proposed activities. We also understand that the area is used year-round for hunting/harvesting, as well as contains historical grave sites. If there are any other groups we should reach out to in the community, beyond the HTO, please let me know.

When we apply for various approvals, permits are typically awarded with a 5 to 7 year timeline. Initially we would likely establish a small exploration camp (within the project area, map attached), which would support ground sampling, ground/air geophysics (supported with a helicopter), and potentially drilling (supported with a helicopter). We don't know exactly what activities will occur in 2025, but are hoping to be active in the area, subject to permitting etc.

Once established, it may be beneficial to try to hire a wildlife monitor from Arviat (in addition to other possible roles in the exploration camp). If there are other ways to work with the community, we would be happy to discuss.

Happy to arrange a call when it is convenient.</p> <p>I have attached a project map, non-technical summary of the project, as well as letter of support from the Arviat CLARC.</p> <p>Subject to permits, 6106 Resources will undertake an exploration drilling program on the project in 2026. This will include the construction of a temporary exploration camp to support these activities. We will abide by mobile caribou mitigation measures, and pause activities while caribou are in the area. The project is located outside of the core calving area for the Qamanirjuaq herd. The project is composed of Crown and IOL (surface/subsurface), which required the Kivalliq Inuit Association to open the area for exploration prior to executing a Mineral Exploration Agreement. We hope to employ as many from the community as we can during the program.</p> <p>It would be helpful to understand if the project does (or does not) overlap the Ghotelnene K’odtineh Dene traditional area.
