The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

1. 6106 Resources Limited is planning to continue its early-stage gold exploration at the Hook Lake Project in the Rankin-Ennadai greenstone belt, Nunavut.
2. Associated NPC FILE No: 150848
3. Summary of modification: The project scope involves establishing and operating a temporary, helicopter-supported exploration camp to support additional drilling and related exploration activities. The proponent intends to apply for a CIRNAC Type A Land Use Permit to support man-days over 400 and amend the current KIA Land Use License for drilling and possible camp location overlap.
4. Location: Kivalliq Region; [near the community of Arviat].

The Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) has completed its review of the above-noted project proposal. The NPC previously reviewed works and activities associated with the current proposal, including exploration activities (conformity determination issued June 20, 2025). This conformity determination still applies.

The NPC has determined that the above-noted project proposal is a significant modification to the project because of the inclusion of intensive drilling activities that require a Type A Land Use Permit. It conforms to the Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan (KRLUP). The proponent has undertaken to comply with the applicable conformity requirements of Appendix C, G, and H of the KRLUP. The project proposal requires screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) because it does not belong to a class of exempt works or activities set out in Schedule 12-1 of the Nunavut Agreement.

By way of this letter, the NPC is forwarding the project proposal to the regulatory authorities identified by the proponent. The regulatory authorities to which this letter is addressed are responsible under the Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act (NUPPAA) to implement any of the applicable requirements by incorporating the requirements directly, or otherwise ensuring that they must be met, in the terms and conditions of any authorizations issued.

This conformity determination applies only to the above noted project proposal as submitted. Proponents may not carry out projects and regulatory authorities may not issue licenses, permits and other authorizations in respect of projects if a review by the NPC is required. Regulatory authorities may consult with the NPC to obtain recommendations on their duties to implement the existing land use plans prior to issuing licenses, permits and other authorizations under subsection 69(6) of the NUPPAA.
