RE: 2BE-IZO1823 – MMG Resources – Izok Project – Type B Water Licence Renewal/Amendment

Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) has reviewed the information submitted to the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) regarding the above-mentioned Type B Water Licence Renewal/Amendment.

ECCC provides expert information and knowledge to project assessments on subjects within the department's mandate, including climate change, air quality, water quality, biodiversity, environmental preparedness and emergencies. This work includes reviewing proponent characterization of environmental effects and mitigation measures, and providing advice to decision makers on activities needed to mitigate these environmental effects. Any comments received from ECCC in this context does not relieve the proponent of its obligations to respect all applicable federal legislation.

The following comment is provided:

1. Open Burning and Incineration

Comment

The Closure and Reclamation Plan discusses the use of incineration and open burning for onsite waste management. ECCC acknowledges that the use of open burning of appropriately segregated wastes is in accordance with guidance from the Government of Nunavut. However, ECCC discourages the practice of open burning as it can result in the release of toxic substances (e.g., dioxins/furans, mercury, heavy metals) to the environment. Controlled incineration that minimizes contaminant releases would be more protective of the environment. Although the Closure and Reclamation Plan describes an on-site incinerator, the plan does not indicate whether ECCC's waste incineration document has been consulted to support best practices.

ECCC Recommendation(s)

ECCC recommends the following regarding open burning and incineration:

- I. Prioritize waste management practices that minimize or eliminate the use of open burning to the extent practicable; and
- II. Consult ECCC's publication "<u>Technical Document for Batch Waste Incineration</u>" for guidance regarding waste incineration to inform waste management practices and relevant plans.
