Re: Surface Exploration Program Notification for MMG Resources Inc.

Dear Richard,

Over recent years, Mario Car has led the Izok Corridor Project for MMG. The work on the project over this period has been largely desktop reviews and, also importantly, supporting the Gray's Bay Port and Road project. Given the good progress being made by West Kitikmeot Resources, our project activities are ramping up.

Given Mario's other duties, I have now taken on the accountability for the Izok Corridor Project for MMG.

The immediate project requirement is to recommence some field exploration work this summer. While we had some difficulties making the arrangements for this, we are now confident we will commence this program with tentative timing to mobilise the crews to the field on 5th July.

The program will run until late August and will not require any ground disturbance – rock chip sample collection only. MMG has contracted Aurora Geosciences of Yellowknife, NT, to conduct this surface exploration work. The exploration program will be conducted in two phases with two teams of three Aurora personnel over two three-week periods between 5 July and 15 September. For the first phase, much of the program, on the northern portion of the CIRNAC mineral claims, will use Bluestar Gold Resources' camp at Ulu as the base, with excursions to and from targets by helicopter. The southern CIRNAC mineral claims will be accessed from an existing camp at Lupin, to be arranged by Aurora Geosciences, in the second phase of the program. If this is not possible, a fly camp will be used at Izok Lake. MMG's existing facilities will not be recommissioned for this program. It is also expected that there will be no requirement for caching fuel on sites apart from the camps at Ulu and Lupin.
