Introduction

In 2001, an eight-tent camp was constructed. The location is at north latitude $73^{\circ}16'36.2''$ and west longitude $88^{\circ}16'15.5''$ on National Topographic System Map 58 D/8. The Jackson River canyon or gorge and the topographic setting can be seen in Figure 1, a photo looking toward the southeast. Tidewater at the head of Jackson Inlet is 10 km west of the camp, that is, to the right of the photo.

This campsite will continue to service the needs of the exploration for the 2006-2007 field season.

Year 2006 Programme

Twin Mining Corporation intends to continue with exploration for the 2006 and 2007. MPH Consulting Inc, Toronto, Ontario will be project manager for year 2006 programme.

In essence the 2006 program will include

- geologic mapping, drilling (20-30holes4000m), trenching/mini-bulk sampling (500 tonnes) in the same relative areas as before, ie. the Freightrain and Cargo-1 kimberlites, plus the thin linear trend of kimberlite that seems to connect the two, all in the immediate vicinity of the camp on the Jackson River and

- prospecting, soil sampling, geological and geophysical surveys over the remaining property area as warranted. Targets identified by these surveys are anticipated to warrant drilling in 2006.

Drilling will be land-based and will be fully helicopter supported. Attempts are also made in every effort to re-hire the same contractors for expediting, trenching, drilling, helicopter supply, and even shipping of the small bulk samples to Montreal.
