Dear Mr. Orin Durey;

This letter is written in response to your letter posted on the Nunavut Water Board comments site. Firstly, I would like to clarify that our project name is Baker Basin Project; and that the 69-4 Zone was only a small area in the western portion of the company's mineral licenses that the company explored in 2006. After completing surface exploration work and a modest amount of diamond drilling in 2006, Pacific Ridge has decided that the 69-4 area does not warrant further exploration at this time and as such will not be pursuing further work in the area. Pacific Ridge will be concentrating its effort north the Caribou Protection Area boundary adjacent to Bissett Lake.

With respect to the location of our drill camp; it was never to be located near Kazan Falls. The permitted location is just west of Bissett Lake approximately 20 kilometers northeast of Kazan Falls. Similarly as per last year's project, Pacific Ridge has decided again to use Baker Lake as base of operations mitigating any need to build a field base camp and less impact to the environment.

With regards to the mess previous mining companies have left at 694 area, Pacific Ridge is committed to being environmentally responsible and has volunteered to remove the fuel drums old hoses left lying around during this coming field season, although it has not been instructed to do so by government authorities.

I hope this letter helps to alleviate some of your concerns regarding the Kazan Falls area as Pacific Ridge is well aware of the sensitivity of the area with respect to Designating Caribou crossings, Caribou Protection Area and archaeological sites. Please be aware that Pacific Ridge does adhere to the Caribou protection Measures. We plan to keep all levels of government informed as well as the members of Baker Lake and in this regard will be holding another community meeting in early summer.

Please also be aware that INAC does monitor our exploration work and we conform to rules and regulations pertaining to establishment of camps and cessation of exploration activity when caribou are present.
