To Whom it may concern,

On behalf of the Kangiqliniq Hunters and Trappers Organization (HTO), I would like to thank the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) for the opportunity to provide comments on Dunnedin's (the proponent) Kahuna Property Field Camp proposal.

The HTO along with the Community of Rankin Inlet have yet to have been consulted by the proponent regarding the proposal despite consultation requests from the HTO. They have pushed off the consultations to January which is after the closing period of comments for this project. This is an issue that should not be taken lightly and was historically an issue with the proponent.

It should also be noted that while the Chesterfield Inlet HTO shows support to the project, the proponent along with Chesterfield Inlet HTO have an agreement not to work on lands that the Chesterfield Inlet Hunters use. Being that the proponent is proposing to build a camp that is closer to the Community of Rankin Inlet and directly on lands that are used by the hunters of Rankin Inlet, the HTO would like to recommend that NIRB extend the commenting period in order to allow proper consultations with the people of Rankin Inlet before this project is allowed to be screened.
