LOCATION OF UNDERTAKING (describe and attach a topographical map, indicating the main components of the Undertaking) At the northwest margins of the Slave Geological Province, DBCE holds remnants of a claim block known as the "Kikerk Lake Property". These 4 claims lie south of Kikerk Lake, approximately 53km due north of Napaktulik (Takijuq) Lake. Activity in 2001 seeks to include the <i>Tree 1</i> claim which adjoins <i>KL 12</i> at the west. Activity will be confined within the approximate parameters 67° 00' 50" 67° 01' 00" and 113° 08' 113° 10'. Latitude: 67° 00' 50" 67° 01' Longitude: 113° 08' - 113° 10' NTS Map No. 86P/03 Scale Regional Location map scale is 1.5cm = 50km; summary map scale is 1.5cm = 500m.		
4. DESCRIPTION OF UNDERTAKING (attach plans and drawings) Continuation of the existing exploration programme (sediment sampling, geophysical surveying and drill testing) first approved under NWB Licence #NWB2KIK and re-authorised under #NWB2KIK0002. A drill programme is planned to occur during April-May, 2001, on Crown land (see attached map). Borehole drilling will be conducted by Boart Longyear, which contractor is now drilling for DBCE in the NWT and is scheduled to conduct a 2-week programme on DBCE's Rockinghorse (Koamaogaktok) property before commencing drilling on the Kikerk project. DBCE plans to drill approximately 5 holes (HQ casing) at the northeast end of Knife Lake, a 1.1m-long shallow lake which straddles the boundary between the KL 12 and Tree 1 claims. DBCE is holder of the KL claims and Designated Operator on the adjoining Tree 1 claim, on which it will earn 51% at the end of the proposed spring, 2001 drill programme. No camp is associated with the Kikerk (Kikkiktalik)/Knife Lake Project; room and board for the crew will be in Kugluktuk.
