This report should include information about activities for the above permit, water quality data, abandonment and restoration of the site, list any unauthorized spills and the follow-up action taken, and any other relevant water use and waste disposal information.

Your last project update was received was dated May 29, 2001.

Should you wish to continue with the exploration, you will need to file an application for renewal of this permit.
