Technical Review Memorandum

To: Phyllis Beaulieu – Manager of Licensing, Nunavut Water Board

Re: 2BE-DIS---- New Water License Application – Dismal Lakes Project – Guyana Precious Metals Inc.

Background

The Dismal Lakes Project is located approximately 60 km south west of Kugluktuk. The site will consist of facilities capable of sustaining 25, on average, 12 people.

The current application is by Guyana Precious Metals Inc. (Guyana) on the site of an expired license which was issued to Coronation Minerals Inc. (Coronation), 2BE-KUG0810. Based on the material provided by the Nunavut Water Board, the connection between Guyana and Coronation, if any, is unclear. The Water Resources Division of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) recommends that the Board seek evidence in relation to this question.

Coronation has not filed the required reporting nor an application to cancel on its expired water license, plus INAC has limited information regarding the site's present conditions. Therefore the Board should be mindful that determining responsibility for site conditions as between Coronation and Guyana might prove difficult in the future, especially if present and past licence applicants are unaffiliated corporations.

The site where Guyana proposes to operate is subject to existing mining claims registered to Rory Calhoun. Additional matters relating to interests in land are unclear in relation to the site. Therefore INAC recommends that pursuant to the Board's section 48(3)(f) authority under the *Nunavut Waters and Nunavut Surface Rights Tribunal Act*, the Board should determine whether Guyana has or can obtain the necessary interests to implement its project.





Recommendations/Comments

INAC recommends that the above referenced water licence # 2BE-DIS---- submitted by Guyana Precious Metals Inc. not be issued until such time as all outstanding issues stated above can be satisfactorily resolved.

INAC further recommends that the Board require additional evidence from the licence applicant on the matters raised in this memorandum and, once that evidence is available for review, seek additional comment and recommendations regarding the above-referenced water licence.
