The proposal has been reviewed to determine whether it is likely to result in impacts to fish and fish habitat which are prohibited by the habitat protection provisions of the *Fisheries Act* or those prohibitions of the *Species at Risk Act* that apply to aquatic species.\*

We understand that the proposed project activities could include:

- Prospecting, geological mapping, sampling, aerial and ground geophysical surveys;
- Helicopter-assisted exploration diamond drilling;
- Mobilization of drills on skids under winter conditions;
- Fuel storage;
- Construction of short spur roads from existing mine roads which will not require water crossings;
- Temporary storage of chemicals and hazardous materials on site;
- Water use for drilling purposes and camp activities;
- Disposal of sewage, grey water and waste generated from camp operations;

DFO has produced an Operational Statement titled "Mineral Exploration Activities" which can be found at the following website:

This operational statement covers activities associated with mineral exploration including:

- Site reconnaissance,
- Small diameter/low density drilling,
- High density drilling and/or bulk sampling through large diameter drilling,
- Surface stripping, trenching and pitting
- Small diameter/low density drilling carried out on ice.

If the proponent can meet the conditions outlined in the Operational Statement, then DFO has no concerns regarding this project as it is unlikely to cause significant adverse effects to fish and fish habitat. If the proponent cannot meet the conditions in the Mineral Exploration Activities Operational Statement, they should submit an application to DFO for review.
