There wasn't any really firm rationale behind the request for the 3-year term. It makes sense to do it for the 5-year term while we are going through the process. The Mouse Lake project needs a long term commitment and I am just hoping that the economy improves fast enough to sustain the momentum that has been built up in the program since 2004.

Your comment on latrine pits has been noted. We have tried the propane-fired incinerator toilets and have found them to be completely inadequate. We will poll the other camps in the area to find out how they are managing the problem and implement the best system available.

Good Afternoon David,

I have conducted a preliminary technical review on your application for renewal and amendment of the Mouse Lake Project. One item worth noting is that a signed application form is required prior to processing the application. Also, the following issues should be addressed prior to a public review:

1. The application currently requests an expiry date of October 31, 2011. If exploration is anticipated for a longer term, would Unor Inc. prefer a longer term Licence such as 5 years?
2. For Unor Inc's. information, more recent Licenses require for camps with greater than 300 person days per year or greater than 1,000 person days for the life of the camp, disposing of sewage in a latrine pit is no longer permitted. Other options such as incineration, chemical or composting toilets remain viable.
