Hello Eva.

The Company management has decided that the heating fuel system at the Mouse Lake camp will no longer be used and will be permanently drained of fuel and dismantled, when work at the camp will be resumed. The fuel that is currently stored in the tanks of the system will be drained into fuel drums and will be handled and dealt with in accordance with the Inspection requirements and all regulations in effect.

The Company will not implement secondary containment to the heating fuel system, since it will be dismantled. As a result, no addenda addressing spill preventative measures through secondary containment and temporary shut-down measures in the case of this system will be added to the Company's Spill Contingency Plan and the Abandonment and Restoration Plan.
