**Request for Open Burning** 

## A. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

On May 13/10 the Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) distributed the May 10/10 Aurora Geosciences Ltd. request for open burning of untreated wood at the Muskox Project Area on behalf of Silvermet Inc. (Licensee). The NWB requested representations from interested parties by May 21/10.

Aurora Geosciences Ltd. intends to burn existing untreated wood structures as part when removing the project's camp this year. It is noted that Part D, Item #2 of the License states, "The Licensee shall not practice open burning or on-site land filling of domestic waste, unless otherwise approved by the Board."

## **B. RESULTS OF REVIEW**

On behalf of Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC), I am providing the following comments / recommendations for the Board's consideration. In carrying out my review I consulted applicable documentation posted on the NWB's online public registry.

- INAC is not opposed to the burning of paper products, paperboard packing, and untreated wood wastes as a progressive and/or final reclamation measure.
- Waste-wood treated with preservatives and non-wood wastes should not be burned.
- Whenever possible, any open burning of untreated wood should be carried out on non-vegetated surfaces (i.e., bedrock, gravel, or sand).
- Any residual non-combustible wastes (e.g., nails and screws) should be collected and disposed of in an appropriate facility.
