Please find attached a report on the Water License Inspection conducted at the Maze Lake Project on the 10th of July, 2012. RE: Inspection of 2BE-MZE0712

The Licensee Terrane Metal is a wholly owned subsidiary of Thompson Creek Metals Company who is partnered with Laurentian Goldfields ("LGF") over the Maze Lake Project. LGF is currently assuming responsibilities over the property owning 57% of the project.

This site is located in the Kivalliq region of Nunavut, at a general location of N 62° 15' 47.1" W 93° 37' 34.4". The camp is situated on Inuit Owned Land though holds authorization for water use and waste disposal under a type "B" license 2BE-MZE0712.

On July 10th, 2012 a compliance inspection was completed on the Maze Lake Project by AANDC Inspector Christine Wilson. A Record of Inspection was completed on-site subsequent to the inspection and a copy of this form was sent via e-mail to the LGF. This form outlined the following compliance issues to be addressed:

- o Fuel requires secondary containment; numerous drums are leaking and must be transferred to secondary containment or be removed from site.
- The license expires on November 30th, 2012; 30 days from the inspection date, a plan must be submitted to the Inspector as to how and when the Maze Lake Project Abandonment and Reclamation Plan will be implemented to ensure compliance with Part I: item (4) and (7) of your
- o Failure to meet annual administrative requirements

On August 7th, 2012 LGF provided details on the actions that will be taken on the noncompliance issues addressed in the Recorded of inspection:

- Copy of the Abandonment and Reclamation plan
- o Remedial measures and budget

On August 9th, 2012 LGF provided further clarity on implementation of action items in the approved A and R plan.

Due to the lateness in the season- weather and lack of resources- the Maze Lake Project was not removed in September 2012. LGF has minimized the risks of the unsecured fuel, until the removal of the camp and associated items can be completed.

This report includes a detailed administrative review, a review of all notes and photographs taken during the July inspection, and reflects those compliance issues which have been addressed and reported on since the inspection.

Part A: Scope and Conditions

No issues were found with respect to the information contained within this section of the license. The license, as issued, is a Type "B" license classed as Industrial –Type B.

Part B: General Conditions

With the information available to the Inspector at the time of this writing, it appears that only one payment of \$30 for water use fees was submitted for the 5 year term of this license therefore payment is required annual from for the remaining years.

A review of the Nunavut Water Board FTP was conducted during the writing of this report. License 2BE-MZE0712 was issued on July12th, 2007 for a period of 5 years. An annual report for year 2007 and 2008 are available for review. The proponent is reminded that in accordance with the Water License an annual report is required to be filed no later than March 31st of each calendar year. The annual report must contain all items listed within item two 2 (i - vi) of this section.

The Licensee is reminded that it is the responsibility of the Licensee to ensure that any documentation submitted by the Licensee to the Nunavut Water Board ("NWB") is acknowledged by the Manager of Licensing.

Part C: Conditions Applying to Water Use

At the time of the inspection the Licensee had been allocated the use of 18 cubic meters of water per day for all purposes. Water of all uses is to come from nearby lakes proximal to the appurtenant undertaking.

No water was being used at the time of the inspection

Part D: Conditions Applying to Waste Disposal

No issues were noted with respect to this section of the license

Part E: Conditions for Camps, Access Infrastructures and Operations

No issues were noted with respect to this section of the license

Part F: Conditions Applying to Drilling Operations

No drilling activities were on-going during the period of inspection.

Part G: Conditions Applying To Modifications

No issues were noted during the period of inspection and none have been reported since by the Licensee.

Part H: Applying To Spill Contingency Planning

An approved Plan entitled "Maze Lake Project Spill Contingency Plan" dated April 23, 2007 is available for review on the NWB FTP site. An addendum to this Plan was to be submitted within (30) days of license issuance. With the information available it appears as though item two (2) (i) (submission of an addendum to the Spill Contingency Plan) of this Section has not been met.

It was noted during the inspection that all fuel was outside of secondary containment, with 5 drums leaking, one of which, at an excelled rate. The Inspector ordered the Licensee to attend the site this year to clean up the spill and transfer all fuel into secondary containment. On September 14th, 2012 LGF submitted proof of the remedial work and mitigation measures initiated in September 2012.

Part I: Conditions Applying to Abandonment and Restoration or Temporary Closure

An approved Plan entitled "Maze Lake Project Abandonment & Restoration Plan" dated April 23, 2007 is available for review on the NWB FTP site. An addendum to this Plan was to be submitted within (30) days of license issuance. With the information available it appears as though item two (2) (i) (submitting an addendum to the Abandonment & Restoration Plan) of this section has still not been met.

This license is to expiry on November 30th, 2012. As the camp and residuals will not be removed before the expiry the Licensee has failed to meet item four (4) and seven (7) of this Section

Part L: Conditions Applying to the Monitoring Program

No issues were noted with respect to this section of the license
