A. BACKGROUND

On May 30, 2017 the Nunavut Water Board provided notification to interested parties that Commander Resources Ltd.-(Licensee) had submitted a Type "B" amendment renewal water licence application, # 2BE-NAD0813.

Dewar Lakes Camp is a mineral exploration camp operated by Commander Resources Ltd since 2003. The camp is located adjacent to the North Warning System Fox-3 airstrip camp location 63°37'59"N 71°6'38". The camp can accommodate 40 personnel and the last activities took place in 2011. The Dewar Lake camp was last occupied in 2011 by Biogenie Ltd contracted by Commander Resources Ltd to clean-up and secure the camp area due to vandalism, damaged camp structures.

The Licensee has submitted a renewal application and has requested an amendment renewal water licence term until June 2027. The Dewar Lake Camp when last inspected by an INAC inspector found that it had been vandalized and damaged again.

Commander Resources Ltd. plan for July 2017 is to clean-up and rebuild the Dewar Lake Camp for upcoming exploration activities. In September 2017 a seasonal shutdown will then take place and the camp will be winterized until the next exploration season.

All interested parties were asked to review the Water Licence renewal application and provide technical comments by June 30, 2017.

B. RESULTS OF REVIEW

Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) Water Resource have no concerns with the renewal amendment application or the term of licence being requested..
