Other Activities

The camp was vandalized and also damaged by a wind storm during 2013. The situation was brought to the attention of Commander Resources during July. Photos were sent to the office and it was decided a clean up crew would have to be sent to the camp to patch up the damage, recover the contents of the camp and winterize it. This was carried out by Biogenie between 20th and 22nd September 2013. The final report is attached and which gives a good visual idea of how much damage was done to the camp.

2014 Planned Work:

At this stage we are uncertain of the program size that will be carried out. Due to the lack of financing opportunities, the junior mining industry is feeling the brunt of Worldwide aversion to risk and has seen the lowest level of financings for the last ten years; therefore we as a Company have decided not to carry out exploration until the Markets improve.

We are still looking for Joint Venture opportunities with Companies that are comfortable with northern exposure.

The existing Dewar Lakes Camp at 68° 37'59" N, 71° 06'38" W, adjacent to the Dewar Air Strip will be used for all future property work.
