# **Technical Memorandum**

## A. BACKGROUND

On July 10, 2018 the Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) provided notification to interested parties that Peregrine Diamond Ltd. – (Licensee) had submitted a Renewal licence for their Type "B" water licence # 2BE-NAN1318 for their Nanuq Project.

Peregrine Diamond Ltd is a diamond exploration company that has operated its Nanuq project since 2003. The Nanuq Project is located 30km south of Wager Bay and 170km east-northeast of the community of Baker Lake in the Kivalliq Region of Nunavut.

Very little to no work has been done with the Project since 2011 as stated by the Annual reports. The camp was demobilized in 2016 with 3 wooden structures, wooden platform, an outhouse and incinerator left in the project area. All fuel and drill equipment were removed from the area.

Peregrine Diamond Ltd. is requesting a 5 year licence until 2023.

All parties were asked to provide technical comments by August 16, 2018.

### **B. RESULTS OF REVIEW**

On behalf of Crown-Indigenous Relations and Northern Affairs Canada – Water Resources, the following comments and recommendations are provided for the Board's consideration.

# 1. Spill Contingency Plan

### Reference:

Nanuq Project Spill Contingency Plan- Dated June 27, 2018

#### Comment:

The Spill Contingency Plan does not indicate where fuel will be located at the project.

### **Recommendation:**

The licensee should provide an Updated Spill Contingency Plan; this update should include the location of all fuel and hazardous waste once the project is running or active. As well, the locations of spill kits, fuel and hazardous waste materials.

An up to date map of site plan with locations of all camp infrastructure would be beneficial.

#### Recommendation

All fuel and Hazardous materials should be stored in secondary containment to prevent spills and leaks.
