Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Indicator Minerals Inc.'s "Nanuq North Exploration" Project Proposal

Dear Andrea Maynes:

On March 4, 2009 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received a positive conformity determination (Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan) from the Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) for Indicator Minerals Inc.'s "Nanuq North Exploration" project proposal, NIRB file number **09EN011**. On March 6, 2009 NIRB also received a land use permit application from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC) in support of this project proposal. On March 9, 2009, the NIRB requested additional information to conduct an environmental screening of the project proposal and received all information requested by March 24, 2009.

The project is located in the Kivalliq region near the communities of Repulse Bay and Chesterfield Inlet. The proposed project activities are planned to occur just south of Wager Bay, adjacent to the southern border of Ukkusiksalik National Park on claims within the Nanuq North property. The exploration activities are proposed to take place from May to September 2009 and continue to 2013.

Exploration activities are proposed to occur March 1, 2009 to September 30, 2009 and continue in 2010.

The project activities include:

- Diamond exploration; including prospecting, mapping, ground geophysics and delineation drilling (land).
- Use of small lake in the Nanuq North property for drilling purposes.
- Temporary fuel caches in the field to support exploration activities.
- Community consultations in 2009 in Baker Lake, Rankin Inlet, Repulse Bay and Chesterfield Inlet.
- Use of Peregrine Diamonds Ltd.'s Nanuq camp.
- Use of Peregrine Diamonds Ltd.'s airstrip.

The NIRB is copying interested Parties and municipalities most affected by Indicator Minerals' project proposal with this letter, and we invite interested persons to comment directly to the NIRB by **April 16, 2009**.

The NIRB would like Parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socio-economic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
