That is a significant amount of gold. Q: with regards to your current licences, have you been through the Land Use Planning? Denise have receive a positive conformity determination from NPC that activities approved under the Keewatin Land Use Plan. A; have some issues with the Draft Land Use Plan, in that some activities proposed would be in an area that we wouldn't be able to explore on. They would be in a Restricted Area. Q: KIA Land use licence – you are waiting for an extension? A: yes, expired in June last year, requested an extension last March but didn't have the work plan for this year. This is something we are here to request approval for. Q: Vickers? A: it is the project that is closest to the current camp and the one that is the most advanced. Q: in the local businesses used, you mention the sealift facility A: the facilities here. It makes transportation of equipment and supplies a lot cheaper for us than flying everything in. Q: what kind of facilities would you need in the future? A: machine shop, repairs, accommodation to name a few Q: where do you purchase your fuel? A: from the Hamlet. We bring in heli fuel as it is not available in the Hamlet. We have about 200 drums now that came in on the barge, but that is only about a months work of what we need. We

	need about two more barge loads. Q: The Hamlet and the HTO recommended that there be no flying below 500', but my wife saw a helicopter flying about 100' last year. They were scaring the caribou. A: that's not supposed to happen. We can talk with our helicopter company to ensure that they know what the rules are. If they don't follow the rules, they can be replaced.
	 Q: you should have a wildlife monitor that is up at the camp 24/7. We have a wildlife officer here in the community but he can't work out at camp. Denise can recommend to the company that they have a dedicated wildlife monitor to not only keep the field crews/camp safe, but to monitor, record and report all wildlife sightings. They can advise the crews when to shut down work also.
	 Q: you are right on the caribou migration route. They come through in the Spring, Juuly and August. A: saw hardly any near camp last year, but did see a few in an area called "White Rock"
	Q: they go through on their way to Northern Manitoba. They come North in about March. Calving area at Quartzite Lake.
	 Q: relocating camp. A: with the drilling at the Vickers target,, the idea is to drill on ice – need drill/camp water in winter. Current lake likely freezes to the bottom.
	 Q: (discusses possible lakes that could be used). Stay close to the access trail and avoid damaging the tundra. A: camp move while snow is on the ground. Work with the community to identify appropriate location. ATV use will be limited to emergency use only. Not like 2016. Rules changing.

New scoreboard for the Arena is in Quebec and will be on the first barge expected to arrive in Whale Cove on July 12.

Have provided support recently for the Fishing Derby, Hamlet Days and Family Days/ Work with the Co-op on Canada Day. When school starts

			again we would be happy to have geologists talk with students about their work and opportunities in exploration. Heard at the last presentation to Council that there were concerns regarding low level flights. 500' chosen unless you advise otherwise that it needs to be higher. If you have any concerns please let us know immediately and we will deal with it. Another thing brought to my attention, is that we shouldn't use the secondary road which is getting chewed up by ATV's. we would like to use ATV's between the staging area and the main road. Will leave the request with you. Also would like to formally put forward a request that we work with the Hamlet to extend the road to camp. Would like Council to consider this request. Longer term thought – right now we are only using the camp in summer because the lake we get our water from, freezes to the bottom. We would like input as to a new camp location. It doesn't have to happen this year, but would depend on the results of this years exploration program.

		 Drilling is nearing completion. We just finished 4 holes out near the storage tent (Vickers), and have moved to Sako (south of the road, just past where the road to the camp turns off from the main road) for 1 or 2 holes, then to just north of the camp for the final hole of the year.
		 Other targets drilled this year include Defender and Howitzer (both in the vicinity of where we drilled so much last year) and two holes out near Bannock Lake, 30 km west of camp.
		 Early in the season, we did geophysical surveys, in small patches between Howitzer and the area just east of the camp
		A major part of the exploration program was collecting soil samples covering the entire claim block that wasn't already sampled (from just north of the airport, to the end of our claims 85km to the west). This work involved using a shovel to pick up about 2 kg of soil and putting it in a sample bag to be sent out for analysis. In total, about 4350 samples were recovered.
		 Most result are still outstanding, so we do not have an idea yet about what follow-up work is required. We will provide an update when we know what we expect to do next year.
		2. Community Update
		 Our plan is to start the cleanup of the drums and propane cylinders at the airport tomorrow. The old drums will be crushed and put into containers. Drums that are in good shape are palletized, ready to be shipped out. The propane cylinders will be consolidated into wooden crates for shipping. All of this will be shipped out on the barge in

			late October.
			 Top Rank, the drilling contractor, is also preparing one of their drills (one we don't use anymore) for shipping south. This is being stored right now at the 2nd barge laydown area outside of town.

David: power point presentation.

Dave explained that Nordgold was a privately owned gold exploration and development company based in Russia. He compared the company with Agnico Eagle for size and numbers of mines in various location.s

He emphasized that the Pistol Bay project was only exploration and at this time was not a mine. He stated that if they didn't discover more gold, it would not become a mine. If more gold was discovered, it could possibly become a mine within ten years.

He further stated that it was important for people to understand that at this time, it was not known if the project would or could become a mine.

He summarized the 2017 exploration program as one that conducted soil sampling, ground geophysics and employed one drill for core sampling. He further emphasized the companies commitment to Safety and Respect for the Environment. All wildlife sightings are recorded and reported in the NWB annual report which was shared with the NIRB, INAC and the KIA.

In 2017 around 8-900 empty fuel drums in storage near the airport, were drained, crushed and loaded into seacan and transported south for disposal on the last sealift.

22 community residents were hired in 2017 to work on the project. There were three lost time injuries and although they were minor in nature, the company would prefer that there be no lost time injuries. It is important that everyone work safely.

Q: are there daily safety meetings?

David: yes, as well as mandatory weekly safety meetings.

David talked about donations and support provided to the community eg., Hamlet Days, Fishing Derby, Nunavut Day, Canada Day and Family Day as well as support for a YMCA program and the Soccer Team. In

addition, two snowmobiles were donated to the local Search and Rescue organization. (applause from the community)

Dave further commented that the company really liked working here and with the Community. It was a pleasure working with a community that was so supportive.

For 2018, Nordgold is currently building a mine in Russia and that has impacted the Pistol Bay exploration project's budget. This year the project will be quite a bit smaller involving just geological mapping and soil sampling but no drilling. The project also would only be a month in duration. So, 4-6 local employees would be hired. David asked that interested people stay after the meeting and provide their contact information to him. People can also speak with Natasha at the Hamlet office who could pass along information to the company. Work would likely start sometime in June.

In addition to the geological mapping program, the company would like to go back to all old drill sites and make sure that the drill collars are cut to ground level to avoid injuries to wildlife and people. He hoped that the exploration budget would be back to 2017 levels for 2019.

David went on to speak about the NPC initiative to have a Nunavut-wide Land Use Plan. Currently there is a Keewatin Land Use Plan, that in the absence of a Nunavut Land Use Plan, stands. The recent draft plan calls for huge areas to be deemed not available for mineral exploration and development due to an understanding that they were sensitive caribou calving grounds or post calving grounds. Hence, the desire to work with the community to examine maps and identify migration and sensitive areas. (done prior to meeting) The company firmly believe that exploration and mining can be conducted in a way that doesn't negatively impact wildlife.

As it stand, the KIA have told the company that the current Land Use Permit will not be renewed past the October 2018 expiration date due to a policy with the KIA that no exploration or development be conducted on Inuit Owned Land. David asked that if the community of Whale Cove was happy with the way Nordgold was conducting its exploration work,

			to tell the Hamlet who can help with this issue with the KIA.
			He further commented that Nordgold is working with the Hamlet to get together a submission to the KIA this week.
			Q: if there is a caribou herd, do you shut down? A: we would work somewhere else from there the caribou area. Helicopters don't fly around caribou. They are told to stay away from caribou herds. So far, we have never had to shut down.
			Lewis: wolves are more of a problem to caribou than helicopters. They are used to the noise now. A; We try to do our best. We have a Policy that our flight elevations are 500' or higher above the tundra. If you see our helicopters behaving in a way that isn't right, tell us and we can do something about it. AEM and others flying helicopters in the area also.
			Q: KIA President cannot stop mining. Hunters from town know more about caribou movement. Not a caribou calving ground. KIA shouldn't just stop it. Caribou pass by. Good area for you to be exploring in,
