Denise thanked Stanley and thanked everyone for coming together to meet with Stan Robinson. The purpose of the meeting is to bring everyone up to speed on proposed exploration activities, ask for a motion to approve amendments to the NWB Water Licence, an

Stan went through a power point presentation (copies will be provided to the KIA, HTO and Hamlet) and asked for questions at any time.

Lewis: why is it called the Pistol Bay Project? Its closer to Wilson Bay Stan: it is a carry over from previous exploration. Even though it is closer to Wilson Bay, another explorer had called it the Wilson Bay Project, and when Northquest took over, it was called the Pistol Bay Project.

Stan A: it shouldn't be called the Pistol Bay Project.

Stan R: we can make a recommendation to Nordgold – since the company is rebranding from Northquest to Nordgold – to work with the community to re-name the project. Do you have any suggestions?

Stan A: not off the top of our heads. Will have to think about it and get back to you.

Stan R Yes, think about it and we can talk about it some more. Maybe there is a local place name for the area.

Stan A: Yes, we will talk about it some more. Are you looking for a motion here or tonight?

Denise: Meeting now with Hamlet, KIA CLARC and HTO in order to approve/motion for extension to KIA LUP and NWB amendments as well as permission from Hamlet to use the landfill. Not at tonights meeting.

Stan A: KIA doesn't have a CLARC any more. Would Hamlet and HTO be okay for a motion?

Denise: yes

Lewis: do you have a location for the new camp?

Stan R: we need to find a lake that doesn't freeze to the bottom in winter so that we can drill on ice in the winter. The current lake near the Vickers target we think, freezes to the bottom, so it isn't useful for that purpose. We need a water body that we can use year round for camp and drilling water.

work with the community to identify an appropriate water Denise: body. Sam: suggest you find an appropriate location close to the road/access trail and avoid spoiling more land good advice. Will take that into consideration. Stan R: Robert: you said in your presentation that "work has to stop if wildlife are in the area", but I have seen that you are still flying helicopters when there are caribou in the area. Can vou make this more serious? Stan R: Yes, absolutely. Stricter rules in 2017 than have been in the past. No longer will ATV's be allowed for use except in emergency. Previous years too much use and impact on the tundra. We want to be more responsible. Break Pat: you said that your WSCC permit has expired. Will the new one be in effect when the camp opens? yes, relatively easy to renew once you have applied for it. Stan R: We will include a number of plans with the application including Spill Plan, Supervisors and emergency contact information. if you are going to move camp for winter drilling, does Robert: there have to be fish in the water? Is the water for camp or drill use? Stan R: no there doesn't have to be fish in the water, but if there are, they won't be harmed. The water is for camp and drill use. We don't allow any contamination to go back into the water. Stan A: all the time we hear from you that "it's all good". We aren't dummies. We want specific answers not just "it looks good". Now you want winter drilling. We are going to be on our guard if you want to be a mine. can give you specifics. In order for Nordgold to take this Stan R: project to become a mine, a study was done in March 2016, to determine how many ounces of gold we would need to find. We

need to discover 2 million ounces of gold. He have discovered 735,000 ounces. That's why we are continuing to drill and hopefully discover more. what's the deepest you have drilled? Stan A: Stan R: 480 meters on an angle Lewis: if a mine starts, will you mill right here? I have heard that ore can be trucked out etc. Stan R: from what I understand, we would mill on site. The only thing being shipped out would be bars of gold. 10 tonnes of rock would get you one ounce of gold. So, for example, the truck of Mike's that we are using, would hold one ounce of gold. Lewis: so you would need a mill, tailings pond and everything that goes with it. Stan R: yes Stan A: its good when locals can work on a project. When your drillers are up here, can they train our people to not just be **night watchmen?** We need drillers and geology training, and field assistants? Stan R: Nordgold can suggest to our drill contractors, and it can be included in their contract, that they train local people to work with the drills. The geologists last year identified several people to do more with the drill and sampling. Denise: the Government of Nunavut puts on Prospector Training Programs and if one hasn't been given in the community, it would be helpful if you asked for one. People who have taken the training and great for exploration companies to hire. In addition, the Drillers Helper Training Program that it run in Arviat – has anyone from Whale Cove taken the training? It would be great if someone has that Nordgold can hire. Also good, if people from Whale Cove take the course. Stan A: recommended to the company that they shop at the coop, and they donate their "points" to the local food bank. The revenue from the local co-op goes right back to help the

			community. Also we asked the company for help with a Scoreboard for the arena, but haven't seen anything yet.  Stan R: yes, continue to shop at the Co-op. Know that the company is working on a scoreboard, but unfortunately it won't be in place for this hockey season.  Stan A: where and when is the public meeting Denise Here is the Hamlet Chambers at 7:00 p.m. Elizabeth Voisey said she would go on community radio.  Suzie: in my experience at camp last year, we were asked to share tents. There were two females that shared a tent, the cooks and I was asked to share. Didn't feel comfortable with this. Would like to see the company have more respect for people.  Denise: in exploration camps and in mining, people need to always expect to share. Likely the only people to have their own tent or room would be the boss.  Stan A: When do you need the motions? Next week is the regular council meeting.  Denise: that's fine. Can send a draft motion to Clayton if you like.

That is a significant amount of gold.</li> <li>Q: with regards to your current licences, have you been through the Land Use Planning?</li> <li>Denise have receive a positive conformity determination from NPC that activities approved under the Keewatin Land Use Plan.</li> <li>A; have some issues with the Draft Land Use Plan, in that some activities proposed would be in an area that we wouldn't be able to explore on. They would be in a Restricted Area.</li> <li>Q: KIA Land use licence – you are waiting for an extension?</li> </ul>

A: yes, expired in June last year, requested an extension last March but didn't have the work plan for this year. This is something we are here to request approval for.
<ul><li>Q: Vickers?</li><li>A: it is the project that is closest to the current camp and the one that is the most advanced.</li></ul>
<ul> <li>Q: in the local businesses used, you mention the sealift facility</li> <li>A: the facilities here. It makes transportation of equipment and supplies a lot cheaper for us than flying everything in.</li> </ul>
Q: what kind of facilities would you need in the future? A: machine shop, repairs, accommodation to name a few
<ul> <li>Q: where do you purchase your fuel?</li> <li>A: from the Hamlet. We bring in heli fuel as it is not available in the Hamlet. We have about 200 drums now that came in on the barge, but that is only about a months work of what we need. We need about two more barge loads.</li> </ul>
Q: The Hamlet and the HTO recommended that there be no flying below 500', but my wife saw a helicopter flying about 100' last year. They were scaring the caribou.
A: that's not supposed to happen. We can talk with our helicopter company to ensure that they know what the rules are. If they don't follow the rules, they can be replaced.
Q: you should have a wildlife monitor that is up at the camp 24/7. We have a wildlife officer here in the community but he can't work out at camp.
Denise can recommend to the company that they have a dedicated wildlife monitor to not only keep the field crews/camp safe, but to monitor, record and report all wildlife sightings. They can advise the crews when to shut down work also.
Q: you are right on the caribou migration route. They come through in the Spring, Juuly and August.
A: saw hardly any near camp last year, but did see a few in an area

	called "White Rock"
Q:	they go through on their way to Northern Manitoba. They come North in about March. Calving area at Quartzite Lake.
Q: A:	relocating camp. with the drilling at the Vickers target,, the idea is to drill on ice – need drill/camp water in winter. Current lake likely freezes to the bottom.
Q: A:	(discusses possible lakes that could be used). Stay close to the access trail and avoid damaging the tundra. camp move while snow is on the ground. Work with the community to identify appropriate location. ATV use will be limited to emergency use only. Not like 2016. Rules changing.
Q: A:	selling the quads? The snowmobiles? no. emergency use. Not day to day use.
Q: A:	plan for the access trail to camp? try to stay on the same trail all the time.
Q: A:	you will probably have more heli fuel on the sea lift yes, need more. Have enough for a month. Need two more sea lifts.
Q: A:	how far inland will you be exploring? shows on map – CZ target on KIA surface land. Likely other areas, but Nordgold hasn't never been up that far yet.
Q: A:	community started here in 1958. Already prospectors were here. Prospecting here since 1939. yes, prospectors on this project since 1960's.
Q; A:	where do you go next? Nordgolds only project currently in Canada. Could be exploring in other areas, don't know.

			Q; in future will you be talking with Nunavut Arctic College about training? They have just opened up a Community Learning Centre here. It would be good to have some training.

			response was that calving is important in the western part of our claim
			block, and that the southern area from Whiterock lake to the coast is
			important for caribou crossing and fishing (as well as being where a lot

			impact on caribou, and that we limit our activities in areas where there

			Again, I thanked them for allowing me to talk to them, and gave them an update on our activities. Then I described to the group the DNLUP caribou protection areas, the KIA's decision to follow the DNLUP even though it isn't in place, and the rumors going around that KIA may in future ask the CLARC to make decisions regarding the access to IOL. Just about all of this seemed to be news to them, but they were absolutely of the opinion that having them make the local decisions was an excellent idea. Guy got a bit defensive about the about the KIA's role, saying that the KIA had no input in establishing the huge protected areas in Kivalliq, but everything quickly settled down when I mentioned that the DNLUP used GN data, and that the data was proving very difficult to access for anyone. The only issue was that the KIA had chosen to follow the DNLUP in making their access decisions. Again, the CLARC is supportive of our work, and understands that though there may be negative impacts of our work, these are balanced off by the jobs we provide. And they are supportive of us having access the WC IOL.

At the same time we were going to interview and hire interested WC residents for work in the 2020 field season. We also had arranged meetings with the HTO in WC, and KIA in Rankin Inlet. All of that, of course, had to be cancelled, or at least deferred because of the virus.  I don't know if you noticed the press release a few weeks ago by Nordgold about our successes at Pistol Bay in 2019 (see attachment). Our drilling last field seasons was successful in extending the known gold mineralization at the Vickers deposit, and the company announced a revised mineral resource calculation with more than double the amount

			of gold from the previous estimate in 2016. Though there is still a lot of work to be done to figure out if there is a mineable reserve at Vickers, the company is pretty excited about the results and we were really looking forward to getting back in there this year and continuing the drilling.  But alas, circumstances dictate that we can't make any firm plans to go back up to Nunavut just yet. Having said that, we haven't totally cancelled the program for the year. It seems unlikely that we will be able
			to start work in late June as was our plan, but it could be possible that we could get in there later in the season for a reduced program. Rest assured that we won't go up until it is clear that our presence there won't represent a risk to the community.
			On another note, we had planned to increase our Inuit employment at the project this summer, by having the drill contractor come to Whale Cove to do interviews and hiring for drill helpers in the community. When we get going again, we will make sure this still happens.
			So that is where we stand at the moment. We will continue to monitor the news to decide when it may be safe to go back out into the world again. And ofcourse I will be in discussions with the people at Nordgold's head office who will weigh in on any ultimate decision if/when to cancel the program for this year.
