RE: NPC File # 150945 [Whale Cove Permanent Project Camp Expansion]

The following works and activities have been proposed in the above-noted project proposal:

- 1. **Primary land use**: Advanced Mineral Exploration
- 2. **Project summary description**: Whale Cove Gold Corp is planning to continue to advanced-stage exploration project (formerly referred to as Pistol Bay Project) near the community of Whale Cove, Nunavut.
- 3. **Summary of modification:** To further improve advanced exploration efficiency, the following activities are proposed:
 - Increase the permanent camp capacity to a 100-person camp, and
 - As needed, operate a 20-person mobile camp on the Whale Cove Project Property.
 - WCGC will renew the Type B water license 2BE-PBP2025, leases and land use permit to reflect the camp expansion.
 - o Increase the number of drills onsite and associated equipment.
 - o Increase of the project footprint to 200kms.
- 4. Associated NPC File No: 148526, 149342, and 149612; Associated NIRB File Nos: 11EN027, and 21CN042
- 5. **Location:** Kivalliq Region [near the Hamlet of Whale Cove]

A complete description of the project proposal reviewed by the Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) can be accessed online using the link below.

The NPC has completed its review of the above-noted project proposal. The NPC previously reviewed works and activities associated with the current proposal with conformity determination issued on March 22, 2011, May 12, 2017, April 1, 2020 and October 25, 2021 respectively. This conformity determination still applies. In addition, associated activities were previously screened by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB File Nos.: 11EN027 & 21CN042). The NPC has determined that the above-noted project proposal is a significant modification to the project because of the increased intensity of mineral activities aimed at advance exploration stage, including expanding the permanent camp to accommodate up to 100 people and significantly increasing the project footprint, as well as the number of diamond drills and related equipment. It conforms to the Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan (KRLUP). The proponent has undertaken to comply with the applicable conformity requirements of Appendix C, G, and H of the KRLUP.

The above-noted project proposal requires screening by the NIRB under section 12.4.3 of the *Nunavut Agreement* as amended because it is for a component or activity that was not part of the original or previously amended proposal and its inclusion is a significant modification of the project.

By way of this letter, the NPC is forwarding the project proposal with this determination to the NIRB for screening. Project materials, including the applicable conformity requirements, are available at the following address: https://lupit.nunavut.ca/portal/registry/registry/aspx?appid=150945

The regulatory authorities to which this letter is addressed are responsible under the *Nunavut Planning and Project Assessment Act (NuPPAA)* to implement any of the applicable requirements by incorporating the requirements directly, or otherwise ensuring that they must be met, in the terms and conditions of any authorizations issued.

This conformity determination applies only to the above noted project proposal as submitted. Proponents may not carry out projects and regulatory authorities may not issue licenses, permits and other authorizations in respect of projects if a review by the NPC is required. Regulatory authorities may consult with the NPC to obtain recommendations on their duties to implement the existing land use plans prior to issuing licenses, permits and other authorizations under subsection 69(6) of the *NuPPAA*.
