A. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

On August 12, 2011 the Nunavut Water Board (the Board) provided notification of Northquest Ltd.'s application to amend their Type 'B' water licence to allow for an increase to their daily water consumption allowance for drilling purposes from 50 to 85 cubic metres (m³) per day. As stated in the cover letter that accompanied this application, "a mathematical error was made in the initial calculations of water consumption for the drill. The original estimate of 50 m³ of water per 24 hour shift was incorrect." No change to the 1 m³ daily water consumption allowance for domestic purposes was requested.

Also included in the submitted application were an Abandonment and Restoration Plan, Spill Contingency Plan, and a map.

B. RESULTS OF REVIEW

On behalf of the Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) Water Resources Division, I am providing the following comments/recommendations for the Board's consideration,

- The AANDC Water Resources Division does not object to the submitted amendment application.
- The Abandonment and Restoration Plan and Spill Contingency Plan distributed for review do not address the revisions specified in Part H, Item #2 and Part I, Item #2 of the water licence. As such, the AANDC Water

Resources Division recommends that Northquest Ltd. submit addendums to these plans with their 2011 Annual Report as required by their water licence.

- The Water Resources Officer telephone contact information provided in Part H, Item #2 of the current water licence is incorrect. The telephone number is 867 975-4295.
- The submitted map, titled, "Proposed Drilling and Campsite Location," is a valuable reference material. However, the AANDC Water Resources Division continues to recommend that the Spill Contingency Plan be revised to include a topographic map (or maps) that identifies the project camp, nearby water sources (including the camp's water source), fuel caches, and any other aspects of the project that may have the potential to impact surrounding water sources. This map (or maps) should be set to an appropriate scale.
