RE: Request for Annual Report for Cameco Corporation's "Aberdeen Lake Camp" Project Proposal

Dear Jennifer Rysavy:

Please be advised that Section 12.7.1 (b) of the Nunavut Land Claims Agreement (NLCA) states:

"a recommendation of Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) pursuant to a 12.4.4 (a) may provide for the establishment of a monitoring program for that project which may specify responsibilities for the proponent, NIRB or Government."

Further, Section 12.7.3 (a) of the NLCA states:

Without limiting the generality of Section 12.7.2, the monitoring program set up pursuant to that section may include:

"a requirement that regulatory agencies and the proponent supply NIRB with reports and information respecting project operations and impacts, and the implementation of mitigative measures."

According to the terms and conditions contained in the Nunavut Impact Review Board's (NIRB or Board) Screening Decision Report issued on April 5, 2012 for the Aberdeen Lake Camp Project Proposal, Cameco Corporation is to submit an Annual Report to the NIRB no later than January 31 of each year the project is in operation. At this time, the NIRB has not yet received Cameco Corporation's annual report for the Aberdeen Lake Camp for the 2014 reporting period.

Cameco Corporation is advised to refer to the terms and conditions issued within the Screening Decision Report (attached) regarding the submission of your Annual Report. The NIRB is requesting this information by June 25, 2015.

The NIRB notes that Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) forwarded a renewal to the Land Use Permit for Cameco Corporation's "Aberdeen Lake Camp" on April 8, 2015. Once the NIRB has received the report as referenced above, the Board will be able to provide a response to AANDC on the recent application.
