Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Advanced Explorations Inc.'s "Roche Bay Mining" Project Proposal

On July 30, 2007 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Advanced Explorations Inc.'s "Roche Bay Mining" land use application from Indian and Northern Affairs Canada (INAC). NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number **07EN058**.

The project is located in the Qikiqtani Region, near the community of Hall Beach.

The Project activities include:

- Sealift landing
- Drill salt (calcium chloride) storage
- Fuel storage

These project activities are connected to current exploration work being carried out on Inuit Owned Lands, previously screened by NIRB in 2006 (NIRB File No. **06EN042**). NIRB would like Parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socioeconomic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
