Dear Ms. Beaulieu:

The Government of Nunavut, Department of Environment (DOE) has reviewed an amendment water license application for the Roche Bay project from Advanced Explorations Inc. (proponent) for advanced exploration of iron ore locating west of Hall Beach. Based on DOE's legislative mandate under the *Environmental Protection Act*, we have the following comments to make regarding spill contingency planning and incineration of wastes.

A. SPILL CONTINGENCY PLAN

Based on DOE Spill Contingency Planning and Reporting Regulations and A Guide to the Spill Contingency Planning and Reporting Regulations, we have the following comment to make:

It is unclear the capacity of the secondary containment. It is advised the
containment will be capable to handle 110 % of the total fuel (i.e., up to 1
million liters potentially); this is advised in the case of worst case spill
scenarios.

B. INCINERATION

The Government of Nunavut is signatory to *Canada-Wide Standards for Dioxins and Furans*, and the *Canada-Wide Standards for Mercury Emissions*. We therefore request the proponent ensures incineration emissions comply with the standards by implementing the following recommendations.

Large camps of over 50 people such as the one for this project shall apply appropriate technologies to ensure complete combustion of wastes, and the use of a dual chamber, controlled-air flow incinerator is recommended. Installation of an incineration device capable of meeting the emission limits established under

Compliance with the standards shall be demonstrated with an initial stack test upon commission of the incinerator at site, the results of which shall be submitted to relevant regulators such as DOE. During the course of operations, the proponent shall make determined efforts to achieve compliance with the standards. Determined efforts shall include but not be limited to appropriate record management, including maintenance reports, operator training logs, and the submission of an annual report that outlines the efforts made to achieve compliance with the standards.
