Dear Mr. Dwyer,

Forum Uranium Corp. will not be establishing a NEW camp this summer; instead, we are RENTING an existing camp from Tanqueray Resources. I believe that when our application was first submitted to the NWB, the deal had not been completed between Forum and Tanqueray, and we were working on the possibility that we would be staying in Baker Lake through the summer. Forum now has the use of the Thom Lake Camp from June to September 2007.

The camp is located on Thom Lake, 30 km west of the hamlet of Baker Lake. The camp is permitted to Tanqueray Resources under KIA license No. KVL103B302, and NWB license 2BE-BAK0709. Geographic coordinates of the camp are as follows: N64deg22min34.4sec, W96deg37min48.2sec
