Subject: Procedure to Neutralize Acids and Bases

Gentlemen:

Attached is a procedure to neutralize the acids and bases at the Kiggavik Camp.

I have spoken with Jean Charles and sent him down to talk to Dan Douglas in the Cluff Lake Lab. Dan will provide him with rubber gloves and pH test paper to conduct this procedure. You will need to purchase the baking soda before going to site.

Procedure to Neutralize Acids and Bases at the Kiggavik Exploration Camp

Objective

To safely neutralize all acids and bases at the camp and dispose of them in an environmentally acceptable manner.

Materials and Supplies

On Site: Two plastic 20 litre pails, chemicals for neutralization, eye protection

To bring: Two large boxes of baking soda, rubber gloves, pH test paper

Procedure

Fill each of the pails half full of water. The first pail will be to conduct the neutralization, the second is to have some wash water immediately available in the event that acids inadvertently get spilled on skin or clothes.

Collect acids and bases. Acids include nitric acid (HNO_3), hydrochloric acid (HCl), Ferric Chloride (FeCl_3) and can be found in two places. The majority of the acids are located on a shelf under the desk in the office shed. There are also some in a labelled 20 litre pail inside the core shack (north door); this pail has "Beak" on it who was the consultant using these chemicals. Be extremely careful in handling these acids as they can inflict a severe burn if spilled on skin; use heavy rubber gloves.

The core shack also has a container of sodium hydroxide (NaOH) which is a base.

Conduct the neutralization outside with the wind at your back to allow ventilation; there will be fumes especially with the hydrochloric acid. Using rubber gloves and eye protection, begin by pouring approximately one half of the bottle of nitric acid into the half pail of water and mix thoroughly. Add NaOH slowly and mix thoroughly. Measure the pH and continue to add base until the contents of the pail are approximately neutral. The pH test paper will provide this measurement by changing color. Anything in the range of pH 5 to 9 is ok.

Using the same procedure, add remaining acid (nitric first then hydrochloric then ferric) then base in the same manner until all chemicals are used up. I believe we may be short of base which is the purpose of the baking soda. After the NaOH is gone, use the baking soda in the same manner.

At the end of the process the pH should be neutral. At this point, the contents of the pail can be poured out as it will simply be salty water.

The potassium dichromate is neither an acid or a base and will have to be transported off site for ultimate disposal.

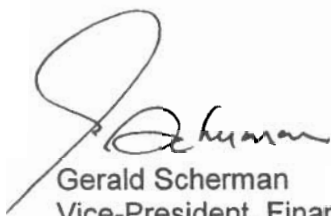
RE: Decommissioning Financial Assurance for Kiggavik/Sissons
