Background

The Slave project is yet to get off the ground. The projected start up date is spring/summer 2010 with a base camp, for 8-12 people, set up at either Penthouse Lake or Esker Lake on the Hood River.

Recommendations/Comments

Amendment No. 2

INAC has no issues with this Amendment. However INAC does have a couple of comments pertaining to the water license.

- INAC suggests, considering that there is the potential for two base camps within the land claims which are spread over a significant land area and two major watersheds that the project in the future, may have to be amended to reflect the different claim areas in use as separate entities.
- As well, when INAC looked at the agreement in place for the disposal of wastes at the Yellowknife facility. The Department of Public Works for the City of Yellowknife states in a letter dated March 23, 2009 that they were willing to accept small amounts of non-combustible waste and recyclables from the Golden Bull Resources exploration camp located within the Northwest Territories but outside Yellowknife City limits. INAC recommends that the agreement be amended to state where exactly the wastes are originating from and if the Department of Public Works will accept wastes from a proponent from Nunavut and not the Northwest Territories.





Inukshuk Exploration Inc. on behalf of Golden Bull Resources is required to provide the Nunavut Water Board all outstanding information referred to above in order to comply with the current water license 2BE-SLA0814.
