Non-Technical Project Summary

Diamonds North Resources Ltd. is planning a spring demobilization program of exploration equipment and supplies located on Crown Land central Victoria Island, Nunavut. In order to safely and inexpensively de-mobilize this equipment from our historic area of exploration Diamonds North is proposing to utilize a D-6 cat, 1 loader and TD-20 Crawler Tractors to pull three 8' x 50' sleds across sea, lake and river ice as well as frozen ground as outlined on the accompanying map. A small Tracked Spryte snow machine and ski-doos and possibly a ski-equipped Twin Otter will also be used for support and safety. All efforts will be made to stay on ice along the route but crossing frozen ground will also be necessary. Topography may also dictate that the access route will need to cross Inuit Owned Lands. It should be noted that the proposed access route will be located on both Inuit Owned and Crown Lands. No structures will be erected as the crew will also tow a caboose for shelter and sleeping purposes. It is expected that the cat train will take about 4-5 days to reach the equipment. About 1-2 days will be spent loading the equipment on to the sleds and a further 4-5 days will be needed to backhaul to Cambridge Bay. This project will therefore be a 2 week endeavour and is not part of any long-term development. For reference please note that Diamonds North conducted this same style of cat train mobilization in 2003 and 2005 with no disturbance to either wildlife or the environment.
