A community open-house meeting to provide information on Kennecott Canada's exploration activities in Nunavut was held on June 22 in Baker Lake, Nunavut. Approximately 20 persons were in attendance. An overview of Kennecott's Nunavut projects including the Thom, Amak, Laughland, Brodeur, and Thirty Mile Projects was presented. Of these, only the Thirty Mile Project is in the Kivalliq district.

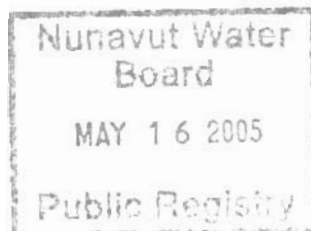
A high level of knowledge of the mining industry was evidenced by the specific questions asked. There were some concerns expressed regarding the Inuit owned subsurface rights, to which KCEI responded that it does not currently have agreements to explore on these type of lands. A number of persons attended looking to obtain fieldwork and to generate ideas regarding possible training initiatives. These will be followed up as the project progresses into 2005.
