PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed “TTMG Project” is located within the Kitikmeot region, approximately 180 kilometres (km) from Cambridge Bay. The Proponent intends to conduct a 5000-meter drilling program that will focus on known gold occurrences located on the Turner Lake and Ted claims. The drill program will operate seasonally during July and August. Accommodations will be provided by the Bathurst Inlet Lodge. The program is proposed to take place from June 2021 to September 2027. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of a Diamond Drill Rig to drill up to 5000 meters at various locations on the properties;
- Use of Bathurst Inlet Lodge and local staff for accommodations;
- Use of a helicopter for daily transport of personnel, supplies and equipment between camp and drill sites; and
- Use of a fixed-winged aircraft to transport personnel, supplies and equipment to and from Bathurst Inlet Lodge.
