

Wales Island – Project Summary

At this time the planned exploration program consists of drilling geophysical targets, ground geophysics on additional geophysical targets and limited till sampling. All of these activities are already authorized under Nunavut Water Board Permit Number NWB2WLS0406.

The proposed amendment involves the establishment of a small, temporary camp designed to accommodate 8 people at a time, for an approximate period of six weeks. Personnel will vary in number and job description but typically will consist of 4 drillers, 1 cook, 1 geologist, 1 pilot, and 1 wildlife officer, totaling a period of approximately 300 man days. Occasional temporary visits may increase population to 10 people for a few days at a time.

Fixed wing support for the camp will be variable and temporary, utilizing a Twin Otter aircraft for the movement of personnel, supplies and equipment. A Hughes 500D helicopter will transport field crews to their work/sampling areas and will remain on site with the personnel for emergency support.

While the exact location of the camp has not yet been finalized, the following locations are being considered (all proposed locations are on Crown Land):
