Dear Ms. Arko:

I am writing in response to your letter of March 9, as well as a meeting between Ryan Barry, Denise Lockett and myself last week, following a conversation with you and Amanda Hanson.

It seems that the best course of action for the Windy Property is to amend the current application with AANDC to reflect only exploration activities proposed this year. This would still include being based at Treeline Lodge on Nueltin Lake in Manitoba ([www.nueltin.com](http://www.nueltin.com)) and crews would be transported via helicopter to/from the Windy Property daily. We would still propose to conduct airborne and ground geophysics as well as soil and lake bottom sediment sampling. No drilling is planned and no camp will be constructed to support exploration activities this year. As such, we will not require a Water License.

Once the amended LUP application has been deemed complete by AANDC, they will distribute to the appropriate authorizing agencies. Depending on the results of this year's exploration activities, we would propose to discuss additional permitting with you and other regulators.

In closing, I would like to thank the staff of NIRB for their continued good advice and look forward to working with you.
