

- (a) pursuant to section 19 of the Territorial Lands Act;
- (i) to order the withdrawal of the lands described in Part One of the Schedule, including all mines, minerals, easements, servitudes and all other interests in real property, from disposal under the Territorial Lands Act, and
- (ii) to set apart and appropriate the lands described in Part One of the Schedule for military purposes, and
- (b) pursuant to section 35 of the Public Works Act, to transfer the management, charge and direction of the lands described in Part One of the Schedule from the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development to the Minister of National Defence for so long as the said lands are required for military purposes, subject to the terms and conditions set out in Part Two of the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Part One

On Ellesmere Island in the Northwest Territories; all that tract of land bounded on the South by the 82°25' parallel of north latitude; on the West by the 62°51' parallel of west longitude; on the North by that part of the Arctic Ocean known as the Lincoln Sea; on the East by the 61°57' parallel of west longitude and including the lands covered by the waters of Colan Bay, Alert Inlet, Dumbell Bay and Pavine Bay.

Part Two

- (1) The requirement for the said lands for military purposes by the Department of National Defence will be reviewed every ten years.
- (2) The Department of the Environment will have continued use and occupation of the weather station site within the said lands.
- (3) A clear horizon will be preserved around the said weather station in accordance with the specifications prescribed by the Ministry of Transport Circular No. 2-C:105-63 of December 5, 1963.
- (4) The Department of the Environment will have continued use of existing rights-of-way for a road, power transmission line and oil pipeline to service the said weather station.
- (5) The Department of the Environment will have continued use of its remote transmitter site and antenna compound situated on the said lands together with the use of existing rights-of-way for a road and power line connecting the aforesaid facilities with the said weather station.
- (6) No restrictions will be placed on the continued operation by the Department of the Environment of the beacon at Cape Belknap, its teletype system or its continued use of the L.F. Remote Transmitter Site of the Department of National Defence.
- (7) The Department of the Environment will have continued rights of access to a fresh water supply from the Dumbell Lakes and to gravel deposits to the west of Cape Belknap.
- (8) The Department of the Environment will have continued use of a right-of-way to maintain its water pipeline from its operations building to the Department of National Defence pump house.
- (9) The Department of National Defence will allow the passage of heavy vehicles and equipment from the said weather station over a route by-passing the seismic vault-magnetometer area.

- (10) Any of the above rights reserved to the Department of the Environment may be exercised, where applicable, by the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources in the operation and maintenance of existing installations under the control of that Department.
- (11) The Department of the Environment and the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources shall enjoy all such other rights and privileges with regard to existing installations as have heretofore been in effect.
