Observations Landfill The landfill was organized and a lot of work has gone in to segregating different material. No waste was observed leaving the landfill footprint.					
Water The water meter at the lake was not working as it was damaged during resupply. The Hamlet is reminded that proper water use records are a condition of the water license and that the water meter should be fixed or replaced as soon as possible. It was also observed that the supply line to the water reservoir has some damage to it and is recommended to be replaced.					
Waste metal dump A lot of work has been done in the waste metal dump to segregate bulk items remove hazardous waste. No waste was observed leaving the footprint of the metal dump.					
Hazardous waste Hazardous waste is now being collected and stored in seacans. A series of seacans are being used at the landfill to store old batteries so they do not leach into the environment. Waste oil drums are now being capped and palletized and were in the process of being stored in seacans during the inspection to prevent them from being exposed to the environment.					
Sewage disposal No issues noted with sewage drop off site and wet land.					
SECTION 3 Comments (s) Non-Compliance with Act or Licence, (s) Action Required (s.3)					
The Hamlet of Chesterfield Inlet has done a lot of work to come into compliance with the water license requirements. The inspector would like the hamlet to focus on record keeping moving forward and as a first step in that direction; the water meter should be fixed or replaced as soon as possible.
