PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed "Coral Harbour Municipal Water Licence Renewal" project is located within the Kivalliq region, within municipal boundaries of Coral Harbour. The Proponent intends to pump water from Post River to the raw water reservoir that must be resupplied annually, all licence requirements will remain the same, except for the change from a Type B water licence which has a daily limit of 300 cubic meters/day, to a Type A water licence which has a maximum daily amount to 2000 cubic meters/day. Resupply of up to 45,000 m3 from Post River must take place during open water season which would take approximately 25 days to ensure sufficient water in the reservoir for the year. The program is proposed to take place from September 30, 2021 to September 29, 2031. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- Use of a Water Pump to draw raw water from Post River into water reservoir for storage until moving to the water treatment plant for chlorination/disinfection
- Use of diesel fuel to power portable water pump and to power the water supply building
- 20 liters for water pump and approximately 2,000 liters for water supply building
- Use of 600 Kg of chlorine in 30 Kg containers and stored in a designed space for chemical storage for chlorination/disinfection in the water treatment plant
