INSPL-fion REPORT - HAMLET OF IGLOOLIK

INTRODUCTION

On August 15th and 17th an inspection was carried out at Igloolik, N.W.T. by Howard Madill, Inspector under the Northern Inland Waters Act. The Inspector was accompanied by Vic Menkal, Municipal Co-ordinator for Water Resources on August 17th. The Hamlet of Igloolik does not have a water license however consideration is being given to licensing this community in the near future.

INSPECTION

A. Water Supply

Water is pumped from South Lake, which is situated 3 kilometers south of the airport to a reservoir located between the airport and the community. A pumphouse at the reservoir supplies water for delivery to the community by truck. Access was not gained to the pumphouse, therefore, the interior was not inspected. A sign near the pumphouse says "danger deep water no trespassing". Some pieces of yellow plastic were noted in the reservoir and an old barrel was on the shore opposite the pumphouse. The pumping station at South Lake was inspected.

The pumping station was not in use at the time of the inspection. The pumping station consisted of a small trailer mounted on skids housing a diesel powered pump. Two 200 gal. fuel tanks similar to the ones used for most single dwellings heating fuel storage were attached to the outside of the building. One was securely attached to the building and supported on the skids. The other one was simply tied to the first tank with a piece of rope and supported with blocking. A more secure arrangement should be found for supporting this tank since a spill from this tank would impact on South Lake.

B. Sewage Collection, Treatment and Disposal

Sewage is disposed of at the waste disposal site situated about 2 kilometers north of the community. Honeybags are disposed of with the domestic garbage and periodically covered with granular material. Liquid sewage is deposited into a small depression at this site from where it drains into the sea approximately 1 kilometer distant.

C. <u>Solid Waste Disposal</u>

The dumpsite is situated approximately 2 kilometers north of the community across Turton Bay. Metal waste is segregated and consolidated in a separate area. The dumpsite is periodically burnt and covered.

D. Fuel Storage

The Hamlet of Igloolik does not own any bulk fuel storage facilities.

E. Surveillance Network Program

Water samples were collected at South Lake near the pumping station intake and at the water reservoir near the intake for the truck fill station.

F. Posting

No signs were noted at the dump. There was a sign indicating "Deep water no trespassing" at the water supply reservoir.

G. Records and Posting

Records were not inspected.
