# SECTION 1 Comments Inspectors Statement

On August 8 2015, a water licence inspection was conducted at the Hamlet of Igloolik, Qikiqtani Region, Nunavut. Sites inspected included the freshwater lake (South Lake), potential secondary water source (Fish Lake), water storage reservoir, sewage lagoon, metal storage facility.

Non-Compliance with Act or Licence

A new water licence was issued for March 31, 2015 and is to expire on March 30, 2020.

### Water Use and related structures:

- 1. The Licencee is permitted to use up to 299 cu m of water per day. Appropriate records of water use were being maintained.
- 2. Water is being withdrawn from South Lake using the appropriate Water Supply Facilities and is stored at the Hamlet Reservoir. At the time of inspection, South Lake was actively being pumped to fill the reservoir before freeze-up.
- 3. Fish Lake was inspected; no water was being used from this lake at the time of inspection. The Licencee is encouraged to include the use of water from this lake in an amendment in case of an emergency.
- 4. No concerns with erosion or sedimentation were apparent at the time of inspection at any Water Use Facility or related structure.

#### **Waste Water Treatment Facility**

- 5. At the time of inspection, the sewage lagoon was in-use, operating as intended, and was retaining the sewage until decanting occurs.
- 6. Berm walls surrounding the facility did not show signs of slumping or cracking.
- 7. Freeboard height was sufficient.
- 8. No concerns were noted with the operation of this facility.

#### **Metal Storage Area:**

- 9. Metal and Hazardous Wastes were being segregated in the Metal Storage Area.
- 10. Hazardous wastes were being stored in sea cans in preparation for southern disposal. No signs of waste entering water were noted at this area.

**Domestic Waste Facility** 

- 11. The Licensee manages domestic waste through a burning and covering procedure.
- 12. The Licence requires that all solid wastes be permanently contained within the Solid Waste Disposal Facility. There were no signs of leachate coming from the facility at the time of inspection; however, considering this is an unlined and unbermed facility, leachate generation during rain events is likely.
- 13. Since the Domestic Waste Facility in its current form is an approved facility under the water licence, the Water Board and/or Hamlet should address the management of leachate and include its generation and discharge as part of the water licence.

## Reports/Records:

- 14. Records for Water Use were in good order.
- 15. Issues related to Part H (Monitoring Program) of the Licence will be addressed during the next Water Licence Compliance Working Group.
