Upon observing, we found that when the fuel tank was last filled there was not enough room left for expansion should the weather warm up. The fuel in the tank expanded in the warm weather, and approximately 20 litres leaked out of the fuel gauge on the top of the fuel tank on to the ground immediately under the tank. City employees used shovels to clean up contaminated soil under the tank, and got as much as they could until the ground thawed more. On June 03, 2010 another attempt to clean up the remaining contaminated soil was done. The remaining contaminated soil was removed and taken to a contained disposal site. We are now waiting for permission to backfill the site upon approval from Environment and Oceans and Fisheries. Approximately 1.5 cubic meters of soil were removed. Upon approval, site will be backfilled with gravel, or excavate more material if required.</b>
