Upon examining, they noticed that the lift pumps at the lift station were not running, and the electrical breakers needed to be reset. Once the breakers were reset, the sewage levels returned to normal and all appeared to be working properly. A loader and dump truck supplied by the city cleaned up any sewage that was spilled on the snow around the manhole and it was hauled to the sewage lagoon for disposal. An electrical contractor was called in to check and repair the high level warning system at the sewage lift station on the morning of Feb 09. This system appears to be working correctly now. The spill of approximately 200 litres was contained by the snow around the manhole, and was easily scraped up with the loader. Regular checks of this area will continue to be done during peak sewage flow times daily.
